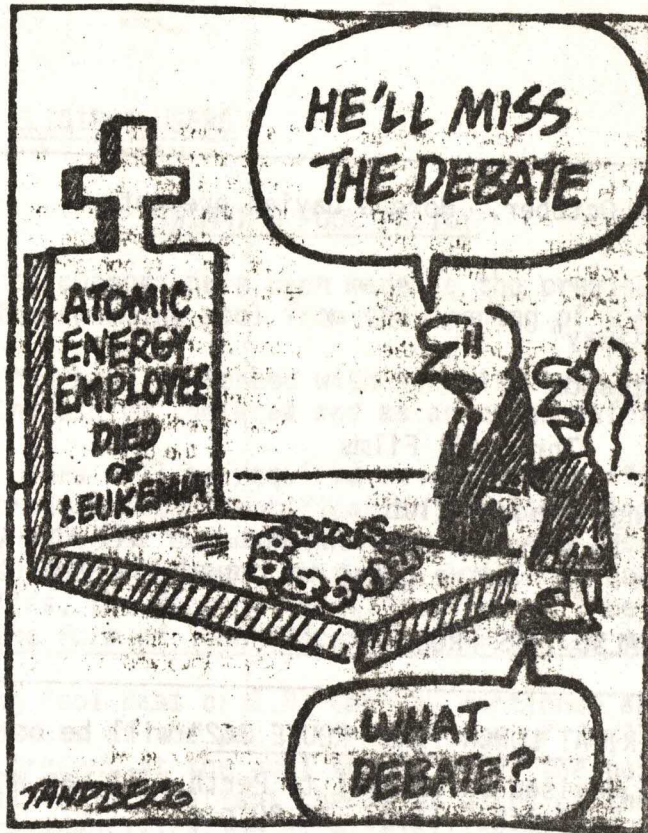

MEMORANDUM TO ELIGIBLE USERSSWIMMING POOL POLICY

A number of changes have been made to the previous policy for administration of the swimming pool from the opening of the 1977/78 season.

The pool has been re-fenced with security type fencing to give greater control over the use of the area and as an added safety measure.

Eligible users will be required to carry identification when using the pool, and to produce such identification of eligibility if requested to do so by security or other authorised staff. In the case of staff members of the College, Agricultural Research Institute and Veterinary Centre, and members of their families, the form of identification will be a "Swimming Pool Pass". For students the form of identification will be the normal student I.D. Card.

A Swimming Pool Pass or I.D. Card as mentioned above, must be carried for all attendances at the pool. In the case of families the senior member of the family present at the pool should carry the pass. It should be noted that there will be intermittent checks on users of the pool and persons not able to produce identification of eligibility may be requested to vacate the area. Misuse of passes may also lead to the cancellation of eligibility to use the pool by the person concerned.

A relaxation of past policy is that eligible users may now invite friends to use the pool provided such friends are accompanied by the eligible user who shall be responsible for their behaviour at the pool.

A number of safety measures have also been introduced. Safety poles with hoops attached have been located in strategic areas to facilitate a rescue. The diving boards have been removed to allow free access for swimming in the whole of the pool without users needing to run the risk of serious injury which could be caused by others misusing the boards.

The squash courts will be in operation by the time the pool opens for the 1977/78 season. Clearly it is difficult to maintain the pool water in good condition if persons use the pool in lieu of showering after a game of squash. Consequently, persons doing so will risk losing their eligibility to use the pool. I hope that no such cases will arise.

Parking on the roadway beside the pool creates a hazardous situation for through traffic. Users of the pool are requested to park on the unmade surface on the southern and eastern sides of the roadway.

The pool is regarded as a teaching facility and timetabled activities by the Physical Education group have precedence over other uses. However, I understand that classes usually occupy only a section of the pool and that persons not involved in such classes may swim in the unoccupied section as directed by the lecturer concerned. On Friday afternoons until 3.00p.m. during school terms, the pool is given over for use by the North Wagga Primary School in accordance with a long established practice.
