

Touch footy can be a lot of fun and intra-mural sport is designed to involve students in exercise - the emphasis being on participation not competition.



EXECUTIVE OFFICERS REPORT



Enrolment Verification Fee

The Finance and Personnel Committee of the College at it's meeting on 29 September rejected my submission regarding the validity of the fee charged to re-establish a student's enrolement.

Most members of the committee are obviously not aware of the distinction between a fee and a fine. There is a substantial difference

between fees and fines as evidenced by the provisions of the College of Advanced Education Act, 1975 and the College, Bylaws.

1) A student does not have the right to appeal against a fee which has been imposed in accordance with the Act and Bylaws and there is no reason why the College would want the enrolment verification charge to be regarded as a fee.

to be regarded as a fee.

2) A student has the right to appeal against a fine imposed by the College and there is a well defined administrative procedure which has to be followed (a paper is available on this matter for those interested)

Few would argue that fines should not be imposed, where the situation is warranted. It is my contention that students who disobey a directive of the Registrar should be fined but should have the right to appeal.


It is obvious that the imposition of the enrolment verification charge is in the nature of a fine and not a fee. This was well demonstrated by the fact that every speaker on the issue at the Finance and Personnel meeting spoke of "penalty" and "disciplinary action".

However, the committee has decided in spite of the above, that the charge shall stand as a fee. It could still be contended that the College does not have the right at law to levy such a fee and cannot give itself the right.

Those students affected will probably be advised to pay up or else in the near future. To those students my only advice is:-

1) If you want to take your case any further call in and see me and representations will be made on your behalf.

- 2). If you do not want to take your case any further - pay up.



Reintroduction of Tertiary Fees

The Department of Education has recently released guidelines for the reintroduction of tertiary fees in 1982. This document confirms recent speculation that the Federal Government is backtracking from it's original intentions, in that there are a host of exceptions and exemptions.

EXECUTIVE OFFICER"S REPORT Cont.

It it almost impossib∜e to summarise this document/which means that thepolicy guidelines are quite complex and in many instances, very confusing. Perhaps the best way to state the government's intentions in one or two lines is:


1. If you already have a tertiary qualification at degree or diploma level and wish to study for a further degree which is not a recognised end-on qualification or an upgrading of an existing qualification then you will pay fees. eg. if you have a degree, in, say business studies and then wish to study law at a degree level, then you will pay fees.

2 It seems clear that the main thrust is to establish the mechanism for collecting fees and administering a loans scheme. Once the machinery is established, then the Government can implement it's unstated intentior to introduce tertiary fees for all studerts.

To set up the mechanism to collect fees and administer loans Colleges and Universities will have todeploy existing staff because they are not funded for additional staff. This will result in areas such as student services being scaled down to staff fee collection - fewer counsellors, advosors, doctors, nurses, and other student support people - the student pays more and receives less - another perversity of the Fraser style of the redistribution of income and wealth.







Some Institutions Have Got It!

Avid readers of recent education thinking will already be aware that the Senate of the University of Sydney and the University of New South Wales have refused to collect. fees for second and higher degrees. The University of New South Wales has also called on the Australian Senate to investigate a comprehens -ive inquiry into all forms of student assistance.

RIVERINA ** TRIO ESTABLISHED

The Direc tor of the Riverina Music Centre, Mr. Roland Bannister today announced the formation of the Riverina Trio, comprising three outstanding young performers on oboe, Flute and Piano. "This is a polit scheme, and is a unique 'first' for Wagga Wagga and the Region", Mr. Bannister aid.

Members of the Riverina Trio are Albin Berky (Oboe), Julia Fekete (Flute) and Francis Louran (Piano).

Albin and Julia are Czech-born and trained, while Francis is a recent graduate of the NSW State Conservatorium of Music.

All three musicians are in their twenties, and already are perform.
-ers of outstanding attainments.
The newly-formed Trio will be based in Wagga Wagga and will provide teaching and recital services in the region through the Riverina Music Centre.

The Scheme is a pilot project initially for a three-month period and is the direct result of submissions to Federal and State funding bodies by the Riverina Music Centre.

Funding is being provided by the Premier's Department (Division of Cultural Activities), Riverina College of Advanced Education and the Management Collittee of the Riverina Music Centre.

If the Trio's initial residency is successful, funding for 1982 will be sought.

"I'm especially excited by the prospect of involving schools in the Trio's work, in the form of lecture-demonstrations, "Mr.

Bannister said.

"The music centre also plans to tour the Trio in a concert-giving capacity."



The big question is however, who is going to be game enough to lend Gobbler a bike to ride?


