T.E.A.S. FARES ALLOWANCE

Any student who lives away from his permanent home while studying and is receiving T.E.A.S. Living Allowance may apply for FARES ALLOWANCE for travel between his permanent home in Australia and place of study.

You may qualify for Fares Allowance for journeys within Australia as follows:=-

- * A single journey from permanent home to College to commence the course for the year.
- * Up to two return journeys between the institution and permanent home during the year.
- * A single journey from the College to permanent home upon completion or discontinuation of studies.

The rate of payment is the equivalent of second class rail fares.
