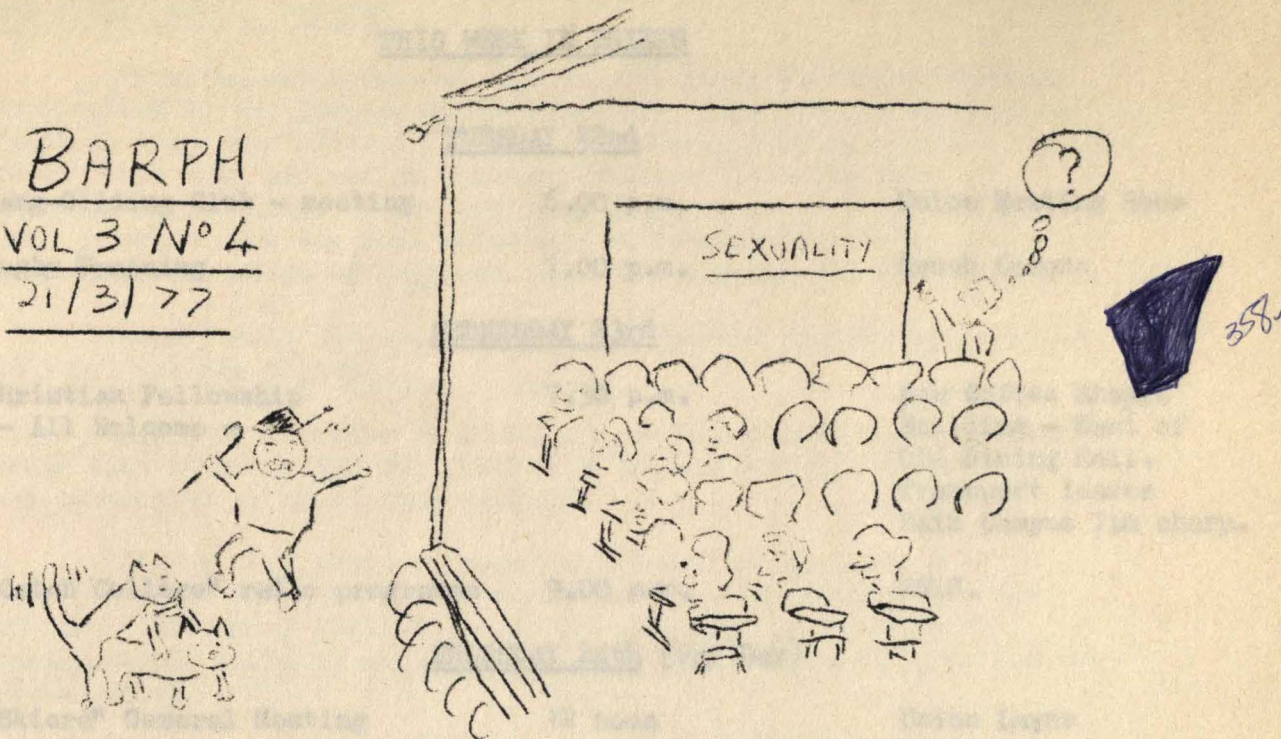

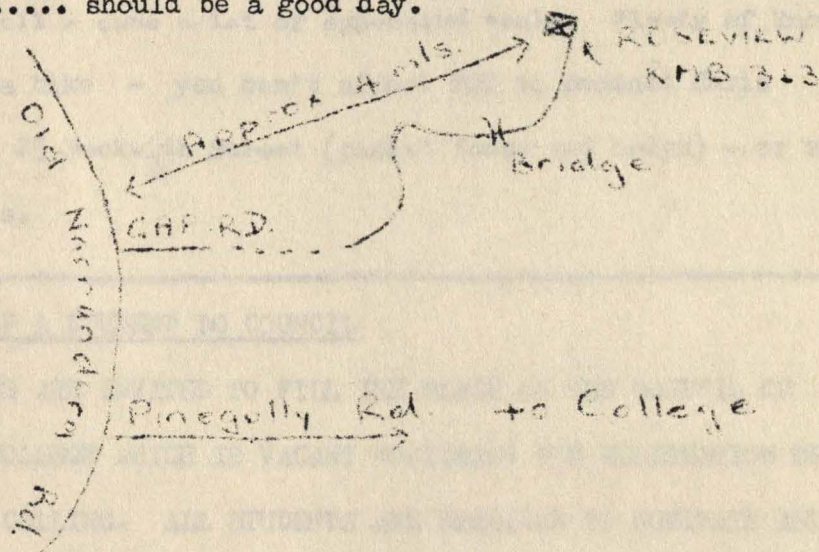
Drama Club Meeting Thursday, 24th March at 1.00 p.m. - New Meeting Rooms in Student Amenities Offices.
