



Dear Sir

I refer to the publicity and distribution of Tertiary Education Assistance Scheme

(TEAS) material in 1982.

In past years, as a way of publicizing the scheme and in order to encourage early applications, TEAS forms were went to as many potential TEAS applicants as possible. In some years, all HSC candidates received forms and in 1981 applications were sent to all students applying to tertiary institutions through the Universities and College Adminissions Centre (UCAC). The response to the individual mailing of forms has been very poor.

As a result, this year all HSC candidates will receive with their results, a card giving information about TEAS and inviting

them to apply for benefits. Applications will then be posted to those students who returned that card to this office.


In addition, applications will be posted directly to those students who did not sit for the HSC in 1981 but apply to tertiary institutions in 1982 through UCAC.

The TEAS closing date of 31 March still applies. HSC candidates should request their forms from this Office in January so that they can lodge them as soon as they enrol. Those who lodge applications after 31 March will not receive benefits from 1 January but rather from the date forms are received.


Any student who is currently recieving TEAS benefits will have an application form sent to his address in December. It is important that students apply as soon as their 1981 results are known (in December/January). Delay could result in their applications being caught up with those of first year students enrolling in February and March.



INTRA MURAL CRICKET


The Intra-Mural Cricket Finale is the focal point of this week's sports activities on campus.


