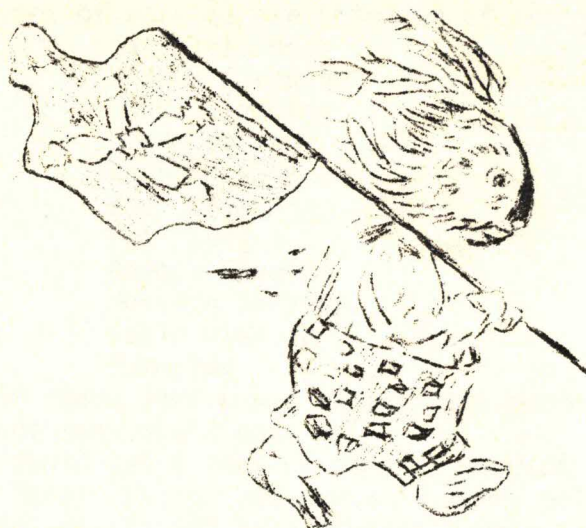

NOTICE TO STAFF AND STUDENTS: SAFE USE OF ROUNDABOUT.

Despite the issue of a number of memos regarding the correct way to use a roundabout, and the placement of various types of safety signs at the two roundabouts in our college road system, several road users within the college still

~~tinue to live dangerously themselves and endanger the lives of others by ignoring elementary road rules in their use of the roundabouts.~~

Regardless of the point of approach to the roundabout, and regardless of whether a driver intends to turn right, left or continue straight ahead, he/she must keep to the left of the roadway and follow the roundabout around until the desired point of exit has been reached. It is highly dangerous to all users of the roadways if a deliberate right hand turn is made against the normal flow of traffic on a roundabout. It is no excuse for a driver to proceed in this manner simply because he/she can see no other traffic is approaching from the right.

I therefore plead with all users of the road system to respect the rights of their fellow users and in so doing so make their approach and exit to and from a roundabout in the correct manner.
