THE FOLLOWING LETTER WAS RECEIVED BY STUDENT SERVICES, FROM NEWCASTLE C.A.E.

Dear Mr. Roffey,

The mature age students in the Diploma of Teaching Courses at this College have become increasingly concerned at their poor prospects of eventual employment by the New South Wales Department of Education upon graduation.

Recently a deputation waited on Mr. Ken Booth the Minister for Sport and Recreation, who is a local member, to place the position before him and to ask him to speak to Mr. Bedford the Education Minister on the subject.

What particularly concerns mature age students is that at the end of their courses they be given consideration for employment based upon academic results and any interview the Department deems necessary, irrespective of whether they have held a Scholarship (of either the old or new variety).

I have been asked by the mature age students' group to contact counsellors in other colleges to ask that they be put in touch with a mature age students' organisation (if such exists) or at least one of the mature age students to see if some concerted approach can be made to Mr. Bedford regarding future employment. The mature age students here envisage first of all having a meeting with representatives of mature age students from other colleges to plan future actions.

If you can help us we would be very grateful.
