About the University

Charles Sturt University was established in July 1989, incorporating the Riverina-Murray Institute of Higher Education at Wagga Wagga and Albury and Mitchell College of Advanced Education at Bathurst, under the academic sponsorship of the University of NSW.

Charles Sturt University — Riverina at Wagga Wagga and Charles Sturt University — Murray at Albury have grown out of a long and proud tradition of providing tertiary education to southern NSW and northern Victoria and throughout Australia by external (correspondence) study.

Murray was established as a campus with the Riverina Campus of the Riverina-Murray Institute of Higher Education in 1984. In 1990 there are more than 700 equivalent full-time students (EFTS) enrolled, and these total slightly in excess of 1200 actual enrolments. It is expected that both EFTS and actual enrolments will more than double over the next decade.

Until 1984 Murray catered mainly for the part-time students attending night time classes.

While opportunities will continue to be offered to part-time enrollees, a concentrated effort is being made to change Murray's profile to one in which it is seen as an accepted provider of full-time tertiary education for school leavers in Albury-Wodonga and Murray region as well as North-East Victoria. Opportunities are now provided for full-time and part-time study in Business and Commerce, Visual Arts, Park Management and Computing.

In addition, external study courses are offered in Parks and Recreation, Park Management, and Industrial Relations.

Murray has three Departments at this time: The Departments of Business Management, Communication and the Arts, and Resource Management. As student enrolments grow, however, it is expected that other Schools will be designated to Murray.

Members of the Departments offer not only formal, accredited courses, but also a range of short and in-service courses, and act as consultants upon request.

Murray is located near the central business district of Albury. The major site has frontage to David, Wilson, Olive and Guinea Streets and makes a very attractive campus comprising of late nineteenth century homes, many with links to Albury's past. The Murray Conservatorium Centre is situated in the heart of the city on the corner of Dean and Olive Streets.
