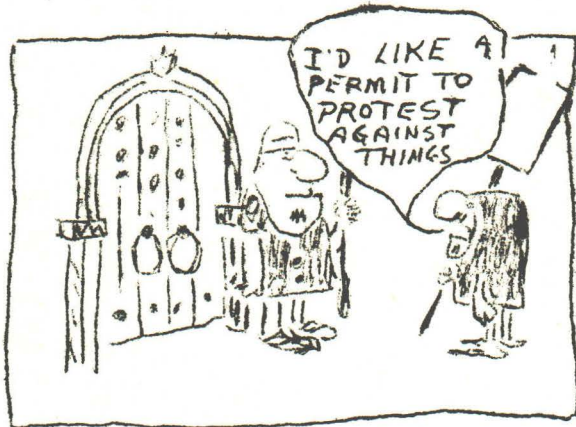

AMALGAMATION

This Thursday, March 31st, 1977, there will be a general meeting at 1.00 p.m. on the Union Lawns. The purpose of this meeting is to decide on the structure of the student organisations. There are 3 student organisations, Student Representatives Council, Union Board of Management and the Sports Union. At the end of Spring Semester '76, there was a motion put at a General Meeting to the effect that the S.R.C. and U.B.M. combine. This motion was passed despite the fact that the motion was raised from the floor and that there did not appear to be an adequate quorum. It is due to these facts that the S.R.C. is holding the General Meeting and referendum this Thursday. It is essential that all students at Rivcoll vote on this issue. The Motion for the Meeting is this:

"THAT AT THE GENERAL STUDENT MEETING ON THE 31st MARCH,
THE FOLLOWING BE PUT TO REFERENDUM:

- (a) AMALGAMATION BETWEEN SPORTS UNION, UNION BOARD OF MANAGEMENT AND STUDENTS REPRESENTATIVE COUNCIL.
- (b) AMALGAMATION BETWEEN SPORTS UNION AND UNION BOARD OF MANAGEMENT.
- (c) AMALGAMATION OF STUDENTS REPRESENTATIVE COUNCIL AND UNION BOARD OF MANAGEMENT.
- (d) NO AMALGAMATION.

THE MINIMUM NUMBER OF VOTES TAKEN AT THE REFERENDUM BE EQUAL TO THE QUORUM FOR A GENERAL MEETING i.e. 100.

THE VOTING WILL CEASE AT 6.00 p.m. TOBY PRENTICE TO BE RETURNING OFFICER.

The S.R.C. has also passed a motion to the effect that they support a proposal formulated by Dr. Cross, the Assistant Principal. This proposal views the most effective form of amalgamation to take place between the Sports Union and the Union Board of Management. The reasons are fairly clear. Both these organisations provide services to the general student body at R.C.A.E. These services cover such aspects as the Food Co-Op., Furniture Market, supply of sporting goods and other retail outlets i.e. the bar etc. Both these bodies are of a basically political nature, whereas the SRC is of a political basis and acts as a representative body to the various college boards and committees, for the general welfare of the students. The SRC would act as a type of watchdog over this combined body and would receive the support of the various employees of the Union i.e. Secretary Manager, Activities Officer.

The SRC urges you to vote for alternative (b). This alternative is the most efficient in terms of long range planning. By amalgamating the UBM and SU, a firmer basis for retail outlets can be established under the auspices of the Secretary/Manager and this will only result in better services for the students at Rivcoll.

The only reason behind the SU and UBM not wishing to amalgamate is that they are both steeped in past traditions and are not willing to look into the future. With the rapid expansion expected at Rivcoll, it is necessary to have student organisations which are effective and on going, and this can be achieved by voting on alternative (b) -- combine the UBM and SU.

All the full details will be put at the meeting on Thursday. Dr. Cross's proposal will be read in full and then it will be up to the students at Rivcoll to vote. As the motion says, the polling booth will be open until 6.00 p.m. under the control of Toby Prentice (S.O.A.) Although voting is not compulsory it makes ultimate sense for all students to vote on this issue because you are the ones who are affected.

Within a few weeks the first output of white wine from the College's winery will be bottled and progressively increasing quantities of white wines will be bottled until about August of this year. Red wines from the current vintage will not be bottled until 1978 at the earliest.

The Winery Management Committee is called for suggestions for names for the College's winery and for the brand under which the College's wines can be disposed of. The two names need not necessarily be the same. For example, the name of the winery may have some local or regional significance, and the brand name may simply be one with general consumer appeal.

Suggestions from any members of the College should be submitted to Dr. Barrie Thistlethwayte, School of Agriculture, by 4.00 p.m. Friday, April 15.

The only restrictions imposed are that the suggested names must be single words of no more than syllables and be such that they cannot be mispronounced or corrupted in other ways.
