The 1990 Conferring of Awards ceremonies mark the start of a new era in tertiary education with the first graduates from Charles Sturt University-Riverina. Established as a major member of the multi-campus Charles Sturt University last year, CSU-Riverina inherits a long tradition in serving the needs of a large area of New South Wales, and elsewhere by external study. Since it opened in 1972 as the Riverina College of Advanced Education and through its growth as Riverina-Murray Institute of Higher Education, the institution has expanded in all areas, with a record enrolment of more than 7,300 students in 1990 in courses by full-time, part-time and external study at Wagga Wagga.

CSU-Riverina features an attractive campus of more than 600 hectares on the northern outskirts of the City of Wagga Wagga. Boorooma Area is the site of ongoing development and the centre for most academic and associated administration functions, lecture facilities and the William Merrylees Library. Agriculture Area was formerly the Wagga Agricultural College before its integration into the university in 1976, and comprises a 544 hectare mixed farm, as well as administrative offices and student residences. In addition, South Area in the southern suburbs of the city itself, is a major residential area of the university. A university bus service runs between South Area and the campus north of Wagga at regular intervals each week day.

In a continuing drive for academic excellence in the quality and scope of its courses, more than 50 courses have been offered at master, postgraduate diploma, degree, diploma and associate diploma level. These courses reflect a responsiveness to community needs and to developments in the areas of agriculture, natural resources, creative and performing arts, business and commerce, computing, humanities and social sciences, teaching and applied science and technology. The university also supports a number of centres for teaching and research in a variety of important fields.

A continuing development programme is a strong feature of the university's growth and a number of major building projects are scheduled for 1990, including a new gymnasium in the area near the swimming pool, radiography facilities, and more self-contained cottages for student accommodation. Planning is also expected to begin on \$4 million extensions to almost treble the area of the current library facilities in the William Merrylees Library. Over 900 students will graduate in the four Conferring of Awards ceremonies of Charles Sturt University-Riverina this year.
