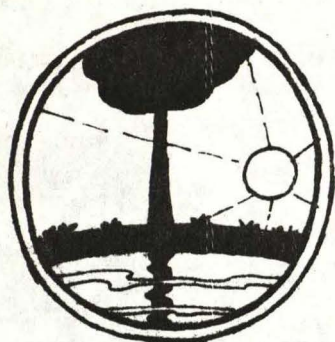

Environment

ITEM 1 - Don't Fence Me In - Last Tuesday's demonstration against the erection of the fence and total security measures was a great success. Publicity on the local media was good and support from both the students and staff was excellent. (Over 700 signatures, not bad for a small College.) The College Administration stated that they would "consider the petition," but as yet nothing has occurred. After such a large response further action will be taken in conjunction with the S.R.C.

ITEM 2 - We're Winning the Nuclear Energy Issue! - Last week an American Congressional Enquiry stated that after 30 years research the nuclear energy industry has still not developed a safe method of disposing of nuclear wastes! Further than this the costs of handling of these wastes may prove to be as expensive as building the nuclear reactors themselves. In recent years orders for nuclear reactors have dropped from 30 per year to 3 or 4 per year.

ITEM 5 - Recipe of the Week -

SPINACH - RICE POT - 4 servings

- 2 cups cooked brown rice
- 2 eggs, beaten
- 2 tbsp. parsley, chopped
- 1/2 tsp. salt
- 1/4 " pepper
- 1/2 cup grated cheese
- 1lb. fresh spinach, chopped
- 2 tbsp. wheatgerm
- 1 " melted butter

Combine rice & cheese. Combine eggs, parsley, salt & pepper. Add the 2 mixtures to raw spinach. Pour into oiled casserole. Top with wh wheatgerm & butter. Bake in 350 oven for 35 min.
