"NEW GAMES"

Since doing some preliminary advertising, we have been continually asked, "What's this New Games?"

New Games was introduced to Australia by the Victorian Dept. Youth and Recreation in January, (as part of the Life Be In It programme), 1976, and in the first five months 70,000 people became "New Games Fanatics".

It is a revolutionery concept for recreation for all ages, all sizes and all levels of ability. New Games came from people who were looking for an alternative to the "tied old traditional party games" or "the big business sports machines" or "the art

and drama" freakies, who had lost touch with reality.

(N.B. We are fortunate that the extreme views as above are not apparent at this College, thank goodness.)

I have seen "New Games" continually -

- enable Grandmothers to play with kids in some games,
- give people permission to play,
- encourage people to share their skills with others.

New Games is an outgrowth of many philosophies -

- soft war, alternative means for the physical release of aggression,
- creative play, as a free-form environment which allows the player to use his imagination by devising new play, and to push his personal limits to achieve a sense of self satisfaction,
- jazz jam idea, where people bring along what they like to do and encourage others to join in,
- people should feel good as a result of choosing to recreate, if there are winners, there are losers. Winners encounter the temptation to cheat to win, while losers eventually loose the desire to play,
- why do people be cast into roles, why can't they enjoy sport, drama and art in the same event or same game,
- look at alternatives,
 - e.g. play with a 6 foot ball instead of a volleyball -
 - use a parachute instead of a trampoline -
 - use people instead of heavy expensive equipment -
 - co-operation and togetherness rather than competition and superiority.
