You may remember that in the early part
of May last I called on you at your
office Cambrai;

To see if you could give me any definite
details of my own 2nd Lieut C. B. Campbell


R. F. C. of 49th Squadron, who was reported
Missing on the 29th November 1917.

I learnt from an officer who was out with
him that day on a bombing expedition
that his machine a de Havilland 4. was
shot down over the German lines, &

I afterwards learnt that he was supposed
to be buried in the East part of the
German Cemetery at Cambrai, ⁱⁿ the

Road

Soleme Cemetery + my daughter. On
I went to visit the grave + found a
grave marked Engr. High Officer Campbell
Nothing more, + then we called on me +
me kindly showed us some German records
where they mentioned High Officer^{C.}; High Officer Denny
had been returned from a shell in Cambrai
& buried in the Soleme Cemetery.

I was not allowed to have the grave opened to try +
identify . Since then I have made many
inquiries at different branches of the U.S.O. +
from me, I enclose a copy of a notice sent me
on the 28th July, which came through from Germany.

Flight Lieut C. B. Campbell was shot down
on the 29th Nov, 1917. He was buried by the
Commandant at Courvoisier.

I shall feel so much obliged if you can tell me
if there is a Cemetery at Courvoisier + just where it is
+ if you have any record of it in your books.
