Tasty Potato & Onion Soup

Ingredients

- ✤···· 8 Cups Water
- ★···· 2x 250ml Tomato soup sachets
- **♦** 4 tsp of Massell Chicken Stock
- ★···· 1 medium Brown Onion, diced
- ✤···· 20 small Potatoes or equivalent, diced
- ✤ Flat-leaved Parsley, roughly chopped
- 1. Place water into a large saucepan, cover and bring to the boil on high heat.
- 2. While water is boiling, dice potatoes and onion.
- 3. When water is boiled, take off cover and place the chicken stock and tomato soup into the pan. Stir till dissolved.
- 4. Add potato and onion to the pan and bring to the boil.
- 5. Boil for a few minutes, then cover and reduce heat to simmer for 5 minutes.
- 6. Chop parsley while potatoes and onion cook till tender.
- 7. Stir parsley into soup a few minutes before serving.

Note: A nicely toasted bread role can be used as a yummy side to the dish.
