My dear Walter

7th Sep. 26.

Thanks for yours of the 22nd of Aug. My cough has not yet quite gone, tho' the nights are getting warmer, & there was a frost this morning.

I think your fine weather will continue. We shall cut out the shearing today & make over 1100 Bales of wool. Possibly our average price of wool will be over 2/ per lb. so we should make more than last year. We shorn the Carey sheep here, & they got a little dust & mud in coming over. We send some 600 feet ^{wethers} ^{off} to Melbourne today in full wool, & the cost of shearing is over £2000.

Please give my love to Kate who I hope is quite well. I fear there will be reactions soon in India. Tell me how your "Kikuyu" roots are growing. I am sending some up to the Manager of Red Hill.
