SYDNEY, Thurs.: The sugar
companies were outstanding per-
formers on the Sydney Stock Ex-
change today.

Gains recorded were C.S.R.
67/3 (up 1/3), Fairymead Sugar
55/ (up 2/9), Gilson and Howes
76/ (up 1/6) and Millaquin 62/6
(up 2/3).

Pioneer Sugar, which has
shown strength in recent months,
sold steady at 55/.

The share price index was up
more than a point to a new high
for the year.

Among the leaders to rise were
Burns Philp 73/6 (up 6d), B.H.P.
52/ (up 3d), Drug Houses 73/9
(up 9d) and Tooth 76/ (up 6d).

The Bank of N.S.W. finished
steady at £51/17/6, after reach-
ing £52 during the day.

Henry Jones, ex rights to its
one for six par issue, had its
first sales today on that basis.
