Dear Sir

I am writing to ask if you will
give me some information
in regard to a British Officer
buried in one of your Cemeteries
near Cambria,

The Cemetery is a military one
close to Cambrai on the road
to Solesmes, + is I think, called
the Porte de Paris Military Cemetery
The Officer is buried in grave no 547
above the grave is a headstone of
Cement, Inscribed "Eng. Hieser Officer
I read in a French Copy of the German

records of the Cemetery that the body was buried there (in a coffin) on December 3rd 1917, after having been disinterred from its first burial place in the "route de Valenciennes". I thought you might be able to give me some details which would make possible the identification of the officer in grave 547.

The officer who is supposed to be buried in grave 547, was ~~of~~ in the Royal Flying Corps, + was reported missing on the 29. Nov. 1917.

Other information given me

said his machine was shot down over the German lines + went down out of Control. I am very anxious to learn of his fate, or even to know for certain if the body of the officer in grave 547, may be his. We are Australians, he went to England to enlist there being at the time No Australian aviation school.
