CSU Professional Placement Equity Grants (PPEG)



The Professional Placement Equity Grant (PPEG) is a CSU initiative to assist CSU undergraduate students who are completing a compulsory professional placement as part of their course requirement.

If you are a CSU undergraduate student who has a compulsory placement for a Session 3, 2014 enrolment, you may be eligible for a PPEG to assist with the costs associated with your Placement.

The funds allocated will depend on the length of your placement, number of eligibility criteria met, funds available balanced with the number of applications received.
