Dear Mr Walter

I thank you very much for your letters & must apologise for not writing you sooner. Our Long Plain sheep have just arrived home looking well & we have plenty of feed here for them. I have not seen the sheep doing better at this time of the year than they are at the present time. We have marked ^{nearly} 11,000 lambs & have a few more to do, they are very fat & growing well.

I think Mr Campbell intends to do the clanning & hopes to start about the 14th or 15th this month. We will have about 6,000 to do so will have to start early. McInnes Bros is doing the shearing & Lon Sully the woolclanning.

I was down to Goulburn last week to a cattle sale & bought 80 bullocks & steers but they are selling very high there. There are a great many cattle coming to this district.
