Many thanks for yours of the 12th Inst. You have had more rain than has fallen here. This award is a very high one, & we must try to decrease it. Instead of paying them 16/- per day, we must try to have them destroying them for the leave to use their skins & carcasses.

Best get Kate show you where the "Kibuyi" grass was planted. There is plenty of grass here, but it is now drying up. We sold our best wethers in Melbourne, in the wool at 32/6 average, & 5000 ^{wethers} lambs are bought at our yards on the 15 Oct at 2/- each.

We shall probably send 10000 sheep to Long Plain & have already nearly 10000 at Carrago.

I sent illustrated Papers to Kate at The Glen, because I had not her address in Sydney.
