Dear Bonnieman

Just a line to thank you for your letter & I wonder whether Charlie has written to anyone at Coimtil this mail we have not heard from him, but have heard news of him through a friend, he feels the cold very much still, & has to work very long hours & very little warmth as Cole is scarce we are told. You'd be glad, but these next few months will be warm, nice for him.

This friend said that Charlie & Co. would have 6 weeks training or study, then go on to practical Machine gun training before they did much fighting. I am thankful that it will be quite warm before he has to go up any distance, & God bless the letters he hoped to write but as we will have some down on the Mongolia, that was very sad that that body boat is lost.

Yes I am afraid that all these disturbances in Russia will delay the war, but I hope you will go from here to Mesopotamia when you go as it's warmer there, a climate more like what you are used to, the English climate is trying in winter evidently.

Anyways we know of General Pryce out there &
And Cunningham, Allet Guthrie Janet
Mother, a few more.

Father has not sent me back Charlie's letter.
I must write him a line.

There is no news, the weather is fine today
But old Jack's eyes seem better, the left one
seems as sensitive as the right one now.
Which is a good sign.

I hope you will get all the riding you can.
